

Guggenheim to Host 2017 Young Collectors Party on March 9

Celebrating the 20th Anniversary of the Young Collectors Council and the Acquisition of Over 140 Works for the Museum's Collection, featuring a DJ Set by Ryan McNamara

2017 Young Collectors Party cochairs Sarah Arison, Laura de Gunzburg, and Nell Diamond; Young Collectors Council (YCC) cochairs Noreen K. What:

The 2017 Guggenheim Young Collectors Party celebrates the 20th anniversary of the YCC, recognizing the acquisition of over 140 works for the museum's permanent collection since 1996 though the Young Collectors Council Art Fund. The evening begins with an intimate cocktail hour and seated dinner in The Wright for YCC and event cochairs, host committee members, and artists from the Guggenheim collection. After dinner, guests celebrate in the museum's iconic rotunda with drinks, dessert, and dancing. Funds raised from the evening will benefit the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum and the Young Collectors Council Art Fund, which supports emerging and established contemporary artists and directly impacts the museum's permanent collection.

Artist Ryan McNamara presents a new DJ set of dance music for the Young Collectors Party. Building on his critically acclaimed performance <u>Battleground</u>, a Works & Process commission that premiered at the Guggenheim in 2016, McNamara has invited Kim Brandt, FlucT, Sam Roeck, and Quenton Stuckey to stage performative interventions in the Guggenheim's iconic rotunda throughout the night in response to his musical selections.
